




Religious Education for All



The Agreed Syllabus for RE
in Nottingham City and Nottinghamshire
Intentions, Implementation and Impact
2021-2026

From January 2021, Northfield Primary School adopted the new Agreed Syllabus in Nottinghamshire and Nottingham, RE for All. This will remain in place until 2026.

RE provokes challenging questions about meaning and purpose in life, beliefs about God, ultimate reality, issues of right and wrong and what it means to be human. Teaching equips pupils with knowledge and understanding of a range of religions and non-religious worldviews, enabling them to develop their ideas, values and identity. It should develop an aptitude for dialogue in pupils so that they can participate positively in our diverse society. Pupils study religions and worldviews systematically, making progress by reflecting on the impact of religions and worldviews on life locally, nationally and globally. Pupils should gain and deploy the skills

needed to interpret and evaluate evidence, texts and sources of wisdom or authority. They learn to articulate clear and coherent accounts of their own personal beliefs, ideas, values and experiences while respecting the right of others to have different views, values and ways of life.

The three aims of RE in Nottinghamshire are:

- 1. That pupils know about and understand a range of religions and worldviews.
- 2. That pupils express ideas and insight about the nature, significance and impact of religions and worldviews.
- 3. That pupils gain and deploy the skills needed to engage seriously with religions and worldviews.

RE at Northfield contributes greatly to a range of school priorities. Through the Agreed Syllabus, spiritual, moral, social and cultural development will be promoted and understanding of British Values will be developed.
